

Owls Homework November and December 2018

This term you have to choose three different projects to complete. Don't rush! To get the best quality work, you will probably need to spend a few sessions on each of them. Try to hand in one piece of homework every two weeks.

Remember to keep reading at home. This is the most important thing for you to do! Keep your reading diary up to date and talk to an adult about what you are reading.

<p><u>Design/Art</u> Can you create your own wartime poster with a message? We will be looking at some of the special posters that were created during the war to give people advice and encouraging them to do their bit to help to win the war.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u> Imagine that you have been evacuated. Write a story about your experiences including the journey and the events that happen to you. Use your imagination, but also think about things that you have learnt to make it realistic.</p>	<p><u>Technology</u> This term you will get to do some wartime cookery in school. Can you find a wartime recipe and have a go at home? Record the instructions for your product and take photographs if you can to show what you have done. You may be able to bring some food in that you have made to share with your classmates.</p>
<p><u>History</u> Can you interview an older person (probably a great-grandparent or somebody who is in their eighties!) who was a child during the war? Were they evacuated or not? What can they remember about the war years? What was different? Try to think of questions that will give longer answers rather than just "yes" or "no". You could do this activity with a partner if one of you cannot find a person to interview.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> We will soon be counting down to Christmas. I have a range of Christmas Maths challenges that you can complete for your homework. You must choose 4 different tasks.</p>	<p><u>Poetry and Performing</u> Your challenge is to write your own winter poem that you can learn (off by heart), read and perform to the class. Think about how you can make your poem effective. It does not need to rhyme.</p> <p>Write your poem out in your neatest handwriting to be displayed in the class.</p>
